Resolution on the reorganization of the academic groups from the Department of Historical Studies

The Rector refers to the resolution of the Board of NTNU on 31 October 2019 in S-sak 38/19:

1. The Board takes note of the matter and decides the following: a. The Department of Historical Studies is to be closed.
2. The Board resolves that:
 - a. Two new departments are to be created, where the “Fate of Nations” research group forms the core of one department as the starting point. Also see the descriptions in the case documents.
 - b. The posts of Heads of Departments are to be advertised as soon as possible and preferably by 31 July 2025.

In principle, the Board’s resolution is implemented on 1 November 2019, and in other respects as soon as practicable. The Board refers to S-sak 34/19 and extends the period in which all activities and all employees that were previously part of the Department of Historical Studies are directly subject to the Rector until 16 December 2019. As of 17 December 2019, both the newly established departments will be transferred back to the Faculty of Humanities.

3. The Board requests the Rector in consultation with the Faculty of Humanities to address the processes of determining:
 - a. Arrangements for contributions to teaching and supervision for programmes of study that span the two departments.
 - b. Arrangements for the distribution of funding between the departments.
 - c. Staffing of the two departments, after discussion with the employee representatives
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4. The Board requests regular briefing on the re-establishment initiatives. The Board requests an evaluation of the arrangement with two departments. The evaluation must emphasize the efforts to improve the work environment, participation and quality of education.

In the light of Board resolution 38/19, the Rector has decided the following:

1) General

The Board's resolution of 31 October 2019 has been a fundamental prerequisite for the Rector's decisions. The case documents set out six principles for the Rector's assessment of the reorganization of the department. It is clear that restoring a sound work environment is the highest priority.

The case documents also make it clear that the Rector is to emphasize "organizational solutions that have sufficient sustainability for academic groups to be maintained, with potential for development, and that tasks within academic administration can be performed as simply as possible." In line with this, the Rector wishes to emphasize – in accordance with the Board's intentions – that two fully functional departments are to be established. Their disciplinary profiles must complement each other and not compete with each other. In addition, the Rector points out the importance of effective arenas for participation and best practice for participation at faculty and department level. In other respects, the Rector refers to the case documents for S-sak 38/19.

2) Staffing of the departments (placement)

The Rector has decided how the two departments are to be staffed. The decision is based on the letters of placement and subsequent discussion meetings with employees. The attached list of placements (*Appendix 1*) shows where all employees will have their place of work.

3) Administration

The Rector has decided that each of the two departments will have its own administration, with five positions at Department X and three positions at Department Y respectively. The attached list of placements shows the department to which each employee belongs. The Rector will later decide whether to assign one extra administrative position to the Faculty administration at HF.

4) Interim Heads of Departments

As interim Heads of Departments, the Rector has designated Erik Opsahl for Department X and Hans Otto Frøland for Department Y. Their term of office is from 16 December 2019 and until Heads of Departments have been appointed in fixed-term posts lasting until 31 July 2025.

5) Organization of study programme management and courses

The Rector has decided that the following principles are to form the basis for this aspect of the activities:

- Management of the one-year programme, the bachelor's and master's programmes in history, and the integrated master's programmes in teacher education in history is to be assigned to the Faculty level. For these programmes, the study programme coordinators report to the Faculty. Management is to take place in cooperation with both departments, the department management teams and teaching staff members who teach courses included in the programmes.
- In the interests of the work environment, two study programme coordinators who have not been involved in the work environment conflict will be appointed. Vice-Dean and Professor Bjørn K. Myskja at the Department of Philosophy and Religious Studies will be the programme coordinator for the history programme and Professor John Brumo at the Department of Language and Literature will head the integrated master's programme in teacher education. The two new departments will each designate one academic employee and one temporary employee for the programme councils. The Faculty, in consultation with the student representatives for the Faculty, will designate student representatives from the bachelor's and master's programmes respectively for the two programme councils.
- The main principle for responsibility for courses will be that the affiliation of the person in the role of course coordinator at any time determines where the responsibility for the courses should lie. The Faculty may consider changing the responsibility for courses during the review of the programme description each year.
- In the interests of reliable and secure operation for the programmes of study, student and academic administration aspects must be included in the consideration of responsibility for courses. The Rector points out that each of the basic courses in history has about 300 students. Administration of these courses is therefore demanding in terms of programme description work, planning of timetables and management of examinations. Responsibility for compulsory basic courses (courses with a HIST1000 code), bachelor's theses, specialization projects in integrated master's programmes in teacher education in history as well as the common theory and method courses for the master's programme in history will therefore be assigned to Department X. Although the basic courses have Department X as their administrative host department, the academic responsibility for the course may be handled by employees at Department Y.

- With the programme description for 2019/2020 as the point of departure, three elective courses have been assigned to Department Y, based on the people associated with the courses (course coordinator and course teachers), and where there are no student and academic administration factors that indicate a different assignment of the courses. These are the courses HIST2008 *Economic History*, HIST3295 *International Economic Contemporary History*, and HIST3400 *The Global Political Economy of Natural Resources, 1870-2000*.
- Responsibility for the courses starts simultaneously with the establishment of the two new departments. Responsibility for allocating teaching staff to the courses will be assigned to the programme councils in consultation with the heads of the departments. If disagreement on the allocation arises, the Dean will decide on the allocation. *The current list of courses for the integrated master's programmes in history and teacher education is attached to this decision (Appendix 2)*

The Dean of HF is tasked with organizing the study activities in line with these principles, and with detailing the organization as needed. The Rector requires arrangements to be made for broad participation from the employees on how the new model is to be introduced in practice.

6) Finances/budget

The Rector refers to the proposal from the working group that has considered financial consequences. The Rector notes that the budget for Department X and Y will be finalized by 17 January 2020 and that the departments will be subject to the same budget model as the other departments at HF; see the decision of the Faculty Board at the Faculty of Humanities on 9 December 2019 in agenda item 6/19.

The Rector supports the proposal that the main principle for allocation of performance-based funds to the two departments should be based on the teaching contribution of the courses and not on organizational affiliation, with the scheme for allocation of performance-based funds that applies to the subject area courses at HF as the starting point.

The Rector provides HF with an extra block grant for 2020 to handle the transition from one to two departments.

7) Process for naming the new departments

The names of the two new departments are to be formally approved by the Board of NTNU at a meeting on 13 February 2020. The Rector wants broad participation from the academic communities on this issue. The Dean of HF has been tasked with setting up a process that

addresses this aspect until she submits a proposal to the Rector. The Rector will submit the matter to the Board.

Proposals for names must be based on the following principles, which were also applicable during the merger at NTNU in 2016/17:

- Names must not indicate competition with the other department
- As far as possible, names must cover the breadth of academic activity at the department
- The names must support effective communication with the outside world.
- The names must start with “Department of...” and should preferably have an abbreviation of three letters

8) Changes in IT systems

Because it will take some time for the names of the new departments to be approved and to ensure reliable and secure operations, few changes due to the reorganization will initially be made in the IT systems. This means that for the moment Innsida, the external web, other websites, common areas, access systems, etc. will be kept as they have been under the Department of Historical Studies. The only change that will be made at the year-end is the establishment of new cost centres in the financial systems.

As soon as the Board of NTNU has approved new department names, the technical IT restructuring and division of the two departments will be implemented.
