

Transferable Skills applicable for the SET disciplines

It is mandatory for the IE-faculty PhD candidates to include a minimum of 5 ECTS within Transferable Skills. All PhD candidates must take a course (minimum 2,5 ECTS) on the topic of Research Ethics at the PhD level. (This does not need to be the specific course listed, i.e. IDT8000 Research Ethics).

All courses shall be documented and approved by the main supervisor, the Head of the PhD Programme Board and the Faculty.

Please note that other courses, including external courses, may also be accepted as part of the academic training,. All courses must be documented and include a course description, learning objectives, number of ECTS, educational level, and form of examination. If a course lacks an evaluation form, you need to ask your department to provide an exam in order to have the course accepted as part of your academic training. You should do so ahead of taking the course. In other words, a document that only states your attendance is not sufficient.

Please note that the course *“Visualize your Science”* is offered by both the company Visualize Your Science AB, which is not an accredited institution and may not offer ECTS or an exam, and by KTH: [KTH | FLS3104](#), which provides both an exam and a complete transcript. Therefore it is recommended to choose the latter option.
